1 PRAYERS

“If we want to bring up a godly family, who shall be a seed to serve God when our heads are under the clods of the valley, let us seek to train them up in the fear of God by meeting together as a family for worship.” -C.H. Spurgeon

“Neglect of private prayer is the locust that devours the strength of the church.” -C.H. Spurgeon

Some helpful principles regarding prayer:

1. Prayer is assumed

“And He said to them, “When you pray, say...” (Lk. 11:2) Jesus doesn’t say “if you pray,” but “when you pray.” Prayer should be a desire of a Christian who wants to stay in tune with God. Jesus assumes that we will want to go to the Father in prayer. Did He assume rightly about you?

2. Prayer should be without pride

Jesus says “When you pray, you are not to be like the hypocrites; for they love to stand and pray in the synagogues and on the street corners so that they may be seen by men. Truly I say to you, they have their reward in full.” (Mt. 6:5) Do not pray to be heard or seen by others. If you do pray for a group or in front of others, make sure that you are in tune with God and not trying to impress.

3. Prayer should be in faith

James says, “But he must ask in faith without any doubting, for the one who doubts is like the surf of the sea, driven and tossed by the wind. For that man ought not to expect that he will receive anything from the Lord, *being* a double-minded man, unstable in all his ways.” (Jm. 1:6-8). If you ask for it, believe that God most definitely can and will answer it. When our desires align with His we have that which we petitioned Him for (I Jn. 5:14-15).

4. Prayer in private is important

Our Lord Jesus gave us a perfect example of the importance of being alone with God.

“After He had sent the crowds away, He went up on the mountain by Himself to pray; and when it was evening, He was there alone.” (Matthew 14:23)

“Then Jesus came with them to a place called Gethsemane, and said to His disciples, “Sit here while I go over there and pray.” (Mt. 26:36)

“In the early morning, while it was still dark, Jesus got up, left the house, and went away to a secluded place, and was praying there” (Mk. 1:35)

“After bidding them farewell, He left for the mountain to pray.” (Mk. 6:46)

“But he would withdraw to desolate places and pray.” (Lk. 5:16)

5. Prayer should be persistent

When speaking about prayer, Jesus tells a parable about a widow who was persistent in petitioning a judge that was looking in to her case. Because of her persistence she won over the judge. After telling this parable, Jesus said, “now, will not God bring about justice for his elect who cry to him day and night, and will he delay long over them? I tell you that he will bring about justice for them quickly.” (Lk. 18:7)

PRAYERS FOR MEMORIZATION:

The Lord's Prayer:

“Our Father who is in heaven hallowed be your name. Thy Kingdom come Thy will be done on earth as it is in heaven. Give us today our daily bread and forgive us our debts as we forgive our debtors, and lead us not into temptation but deliver us from evil. Amen.” –Matthew 6:9-13a

Prayers of Paul:

“For this reason I bow my knees before the Father, from whom every family in heaven and on earth derives its name, that He would grant you, according to the riches of His glory, to be strengthened with power through His Spirit in the inner man, so that Christ may dwell in your hearts through faith; *and* that you, being rooted and grounded in love, may be able to comprehend with all the saints what is the breadth and length and height and depth, and to know the love of Christ which surpasses knowledge, that you may be filled up to all the fullness of God.” -Ephesians 3:14-19

“And we pray this in order that you may live a life worthy of the Lord and may please him in every way: bearing fruit in every good work, growing in the knowledge of God, being strengthened with all power according to his glorious might so that you may have great endurance and patience, and joyfully giving thanks to the Father, who has qualified you to share in the inheritance of the saints in the kingdom of light.” -Colossians 1:10-11

Prayer of Jude:

“Now to Him who is able to keep you from stumbling, and to make you stand in the presence of His glory blameless with great joy, to the only God our Savior, through Jesus Christ our Lord, *be* glory, majesty, dominion and authority, before all time and now and forever. Amen” -Jude 1:24-25

Prayer of David:

“Create in me a clean heart, O God, and renew a steadfast spirit within me. Do not cast me away from Your presence and do not take Your Holy Spirit from me. Restore to me the joy of Your salvation and sustain me with a willing spirit.” -Psalm 51:10-12

If you are struggling to pray:

R. A. Torrey in his book, *How to Pray*, says of George Mueller:

“One of the mightiest men of prayer would begin praying by reading and meditating upon God's Word until a prayer began to form itself in his heart. Thus, God himself was the real author of the prayer, and God answered the prayer which he himself had inspired.”

2 CREEDS

The Nicene Creed

I believe in one God, the Father Almighty, Maker of heaven and earth, and of all things visible and invisible. and in one Lord Jesus Christ, the only-begotten Son of God, begotten of the Father before all worlds; God of God, Light of Light, very God of very God; begotten, not made, being of one substance with the Father, by whom all things were made. Who, for us men and for our salvation, came down from heaven, and was incarnate by the Holy Spirit of the virgin Mary, and was made man; and was crucified also for us under Pontius Pilate; He suffered and was buried; and the third day He rose again, according to the Scriptures; and ascended into heaven, and sits on the right hand of the Father; and He shall come again, with glory, to judge the quick and the dead; whose kingdom shall have no end. and I believe in the Holy Ghost, the Lord and Giver of Life; who proceeds from the Father and the Son; who with the Father and the Son together is worshipped and glorified; who spoke by the prophets. and **I believe one holy catholic and apostolic Church.** I acknowledge one baptism for the remission of sins; and I look for the resurrection of the dead, and the life of the world to come. Amen.

(“catholic” refers to the universal church)

SCRIPTURE TO MEMORIZE WITH CHILDREN

(Family) Ephesians 6:1-4 (1st Grade)

“Children, obey your parents in the Lord, for this is right. HONOR YOUR FATHER AND MOTHER (which is the first commandment with a promise), SO THAT IT MAY BE WELL WITH YOU, AND THAT YOU MAY LIVE LONG ON THE EARTH. Fathers, do not provoke your children to anger, but bring them up in the discipline and instruction of the Lord.”

(Inspiration of the Scriptures) II Peter 1:16-21 (2nd Grade)

“For we did not follow cleverly devised tales when we made known to you the power and coming of our Lord Jesus Christ, but we were eyewitnesses of His majesty. For when He received honor and glory from God the Father, such an utterance as this was made to Him by the Majestic Glory, "This is My beloved Son with whom I am well-pleased"—and we ourselves heard this utterance made from heaven when we were with Him on the holy mountain. So we have the prophetic word made more sure, to which you do well to pay attention as to a lamp shining in a dark place, until the day dawns and the morning star arises in your hearts. But know this first of all, that no prophecy of Scripture is a matter of one's own interpretation, for no prophecy was ever made by an act of human will, but men moved by the Holy Spirit spoke from God.”

(The Beatitudes) Matthew 5:3-11 (3rd Grade)

“Blessed are the poor in spirit, for theirs is the kingdom of heaven. Blessed are those who mourn, for they shall be comforted. Blessed are the gentle, for they shall inherit the earth. Blessed are those who hunger and thirst for righteousness, for they shall be satisfied. Blessed are

the merciful, for they shall receive mercy. Blessed are the pure in heart, for they shall see God. Blessed are the peacemakers, for they shall be called sons of God. Blessed are those who have been persecuted for the sake of righteousness, for theirs is the kingdom of heaven. Blessed are you when people insult you and persecute you, and falsely say all kinds of evil against you because of me.”

(The “Carmen Christi” or Song of Christ) Philippians 2:5-11 (4th - 5th Grade)

“Have this attitude in yourselves which was also in Christ Jesus, who, although He existed in the form of God, did not regard equality with God a thing to be grasped, but emptied Himself, taking the form of a bond-servant, and being made in the likeness of men. Being found in appearance as a man, He humbled Himself by becoming obedient to the point of death, even death on a cross. For this reason also, God highly exalted Him, and bestowed on Him the name which is above every name, so that at the name of Jesus every knee will bow, of those who are in heaven and on earth and under the earth, and that every tongue will confess that Jesus Christ is Lord, to the glory of God the Father.”


